



Rate at which trans-inclusive organizations which focused on Black women and girls were less likely to receive foundation funding (20.6%) and more likely to receive government funding (84.4%). Trans-inclusive organizations that focus on Black women and girls were much more likely to have budgets of less than \$20,000.6
